Research shows FLiRT variants spread more quickly than previous variants have before. As of May 2024, KP.2 accounts for 28.2% of cases, and JN.1.7accounts for 13.3% The newest COVID-19 vaccine has the XBB.1.5 spike protein, which helps protect against these FLiRT variants.
