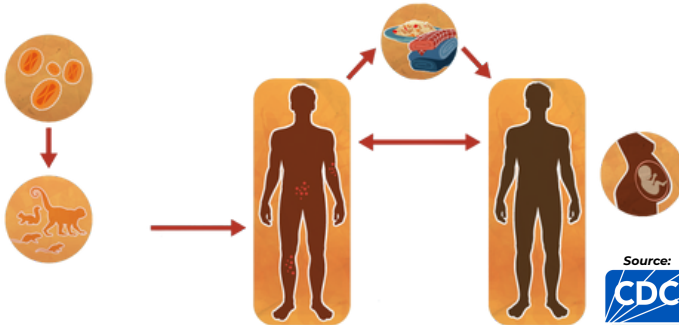
What is Mpox?

- Mpox is an illness caused by a virus in the same family as the virus that causes smallpox.
- People with Mpox often get a rash, fever, headaches, swollen lymph nodes, and body aches.

Looking for the Mpox vaccine?



How does it spread?



- Mpox can start by spreading from animals to people through scratches, bites, or by handling and eating infected animal products.
- Once a person has Mpox, it can spread to others through close, skin-to-skin contact.
- This includes contact during sex, massages, kissing, and other everyday activities.



Prevention

- A 2-dose JYNNEOS vaccine that offers protection against Mpox and smallpox.
- People need both doses of the JYNNEOS for the best protection.

What is Mpox?

Mpox is a viral illness caused by the monkeypox virus. It typically spreads through prolonged close, skin-to-skin contact with a person who has Mpox.

Symptoms



Rash, bumps
or blisters



Fever and
headaches



Swollen
lymph nodes



Body aches

Prevention

- Jynneos is a 2-dose vaccine offering protection against Mpox and smallpox.
- The second dose should be given 4 weeks after the first dose.

Who should get vaccinated?

- Known or suspected exposure to someone with mpox.
- Had a sex partner in the past 2 weeks who was diagnosed with mpox.
- Gay, bisexual, or other man who has sex with men (MSM).
- People traveling to a country with a mpox outbreak.
