The Vision








Community Engagement Foundation



Community Engagement: Collaborative processes between organizations/institutions and communities impacted by their policies, programs, or practices to influence decisions and actions through the mutually beneficial and bidirectional exchange of resources, expertise, and information.

- **Identifies** and addresses disparities
- **Ensures** relevance
- **Builds** trust and equity
- **Drives** systematic change
- **Fosters** authentic partnerships

[Executive Order 2005-056 \(New Mexico\): State Executive Order](#)

Requires state agencies to ensure fair treatment and meaningful involvement of environmental justice communities. Provides a model for strengthening outreach, notice, and participation in decision-making.



[RCW 70A.02.110 \(Washington\): State Statute](#)

Creates the Environmental Justice Council to advise agencies on integrating equity into policies and programs. Demonstrates how government can formalize community representation in decision-making.





RCW 43.06D.040 (Washington): State Statute

Defines the responsibilities of the Office of Equity, including staffing a community advisory board and improving access to engagement. Offers a structure for building equity accountability into government systems.



Community Engagement Best Practices Self-Assessment Tool: Assessment Tool

A seven-domain self-assessment that helps organizations identify strengths and gaps in their engagement practices. Useful for evaluating readiness and improving partnership quality.





California Community Engagement Initiative Modules: Training Modules

Provides comprehensive learning modules on building partnerships, shared leadership, and authentic community engagement. Offers ready-to-use trainings for staff capacity building.



CARB Community Engagement Workbook: Planning Workbook

A step-by-step guide for planning, implementing, and evaluating equitable community engagement efforts. Includes worksheets and planning tools to support structured engagement design.





[CARB Community Engagement Model \(Full Model\): Engagement Framework](#)

A comprehensive, evidence-based model outlining principles, processes, and best practices for equitable engagement in environmental and public health work. Serves as a blueprint for citywide engagement planning.



[AB 2722 – Transformative Climate Communities Program: Grant Program](#)

Establishes requirements for deep community engagement in neighborhood-scale climate and health planning. Demonstrates how engagement can be embedded into funding structures and program design.





UNIDAD Comment Letter:

Community Advocacy Document

An example of resident-driven recommendations influencing land-use and community planning decisions. Highlights the power of organized community input in shaping healthier, more equitable neighborhoods.



PHERN Building Bridges Portal:
