Measles Testing Guidance

Testing methodology: Detection of viral RNA by reverse transcription real-time polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR). Turnaround time: 3 business days

Specimens

Throat/Oropharyngeal (preferred) or NP Swab

- Collect within 2 weeks of rash onset.
- Use a sterile synthetic swab (e.g., Dacron).
- Throat swab (preferred respiratory specimen): vigorously swab tonsillar areas with sterile Dacron swab.
- Nasopharyngeal swab: firmly rub posterior nasopharynx with sterile Dacron swab.
- Place swab into liquid viral transport media (VTM) or universal transport media (UTM). Minimum volume 2-3 ml. Do not use bacterial transport media.

<u>Urine</u> (unprocessed or processed)

- Unprocessed urine: collect 10-50 ml urine in a sterile container, within 2 weeks of rash onset. Collect from the first part of the urine stream. The first morning void is ideal.
- Processed urine: centrifuge 50-100 ml of urine at 2500 x g for 15 minutes at 2-8°C. Resuspend the pellet in 2-3 ml of VTM or UTM. If processing is not possible, store and ship the sample at 2°-8°C within 24 hours.

Specimen Storage and Shipping

- Respiratory swabs and urine pellets: freeze or refrigerate specimens promptly after collection.
- Unprocessed urine: refrigerate specimens promptly after collection. Do not freeze unprocessed urine.
- Ship refrigerated specimens on cold packs, frozen specimens on dry ice within 24-72 hours.
